

Amended guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003: Error

Introduction

The following note should be read in conjunction with the amended Guidance, laid in Parliament and issued by the Home Secretary on 31 October 2012, under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Chapter 7 of the Guidance on Temporary Event Notices (TENs)

The last two sentences of **paragraph 7.3** read as follows:

“Working day” under the 2003 Act means any day other than a Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or Bank Holiday. For limited purposes in relation to a TEN, a day is defined as a period of 24 hours beginning at midnight.

The word “Saturday” was omitted in error. The extract should read as follows:

*“Working day” under the 2003 Act means any day other than **a Saturday**, Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or Bank Holiday. For limited purposes in relation to a TEN, a day is defined as a period of 24 hours beginning at midnight.*

The correction will be made in the next revision of the Guidance.

The Home Office makes every effort to ensure that the document is accurate and apologises for the error. The relationship between the Guidance and the law is set out at paragraphs 1.6 to 1.10 of the current Guidance.
